BRACKETTVILLE-ESCONDIDO

TRANSMISSION IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT



AEP Texas representatives plan to strengthen the electric transmission system in Kinney and Maverick counties by building a 138-kilovolt (kV) power line.

WHAT

The project involves building approximately 45 miles of new 138-kV transmission line between AEP Texas' Brackettville and Escondido substations.

WHY

The Brackettville - Escondido Transmission Improvements Project:

- Improves reliability of the regional electric system
- Decreases the likelihood and duration of wide, community-sustained outages

WHERE

The transmission line:

- Begins at the Brackettville Substation, located about 1 mile east of Brackettville along State Highway 334
- Ends at the Escondido Substation, located at the intersection of Encino Drive and Town Square Boulevard in Eagle Pass


