

Lyka Transmission Project

AEP Ohio representatives plan to upgrade the electric transmission network in Allen County. The Lyka Transmission Project involves building a substation and about 4 miles of 345-kilovolt (kV) transmission line. If approved, crews plan to begin construction in fall 2027 and conclude by summer 2028.

What

The project* involves:

- Building Lyka Substation, located on customer-owned property between North West and North Cole streets.
- Building about 4 miles of 345-kV transmission line between the proposed Lyka Substation and an existing transmission line located north of West Hook-Waltz and Tudor roads.

*This project involves Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) approval.

Why

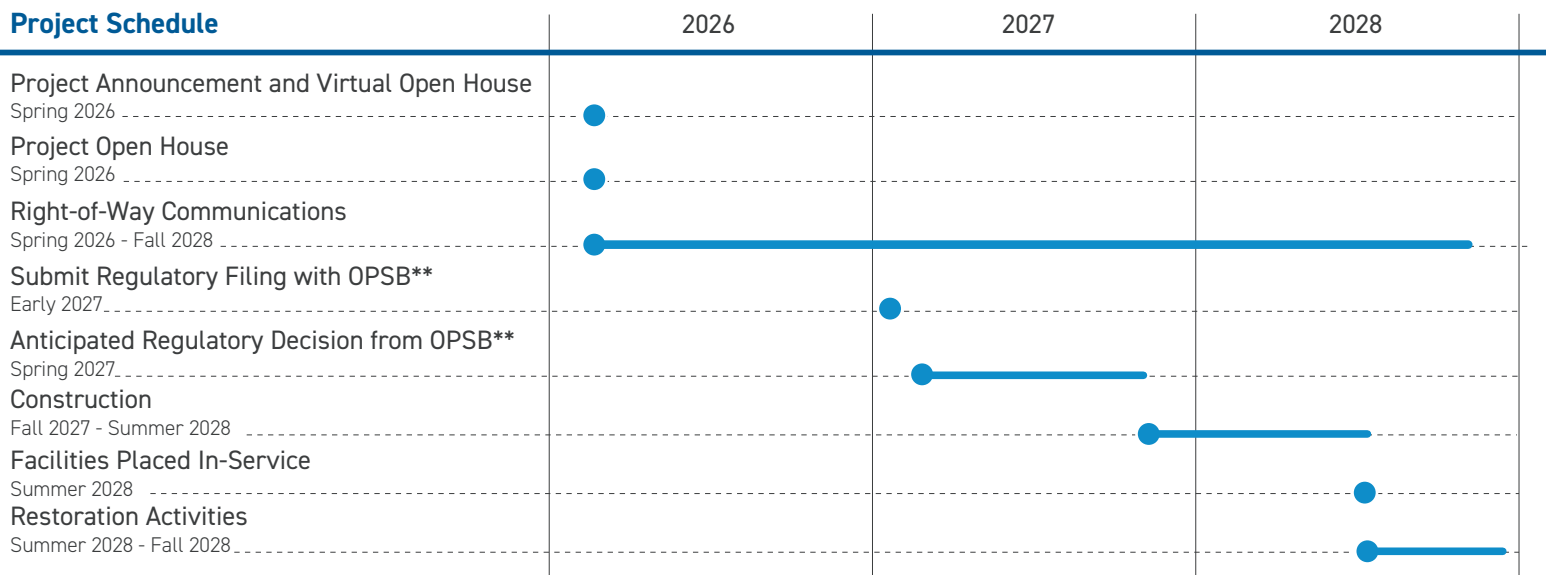
The project:

- Provides service for a commercial customer's facility.

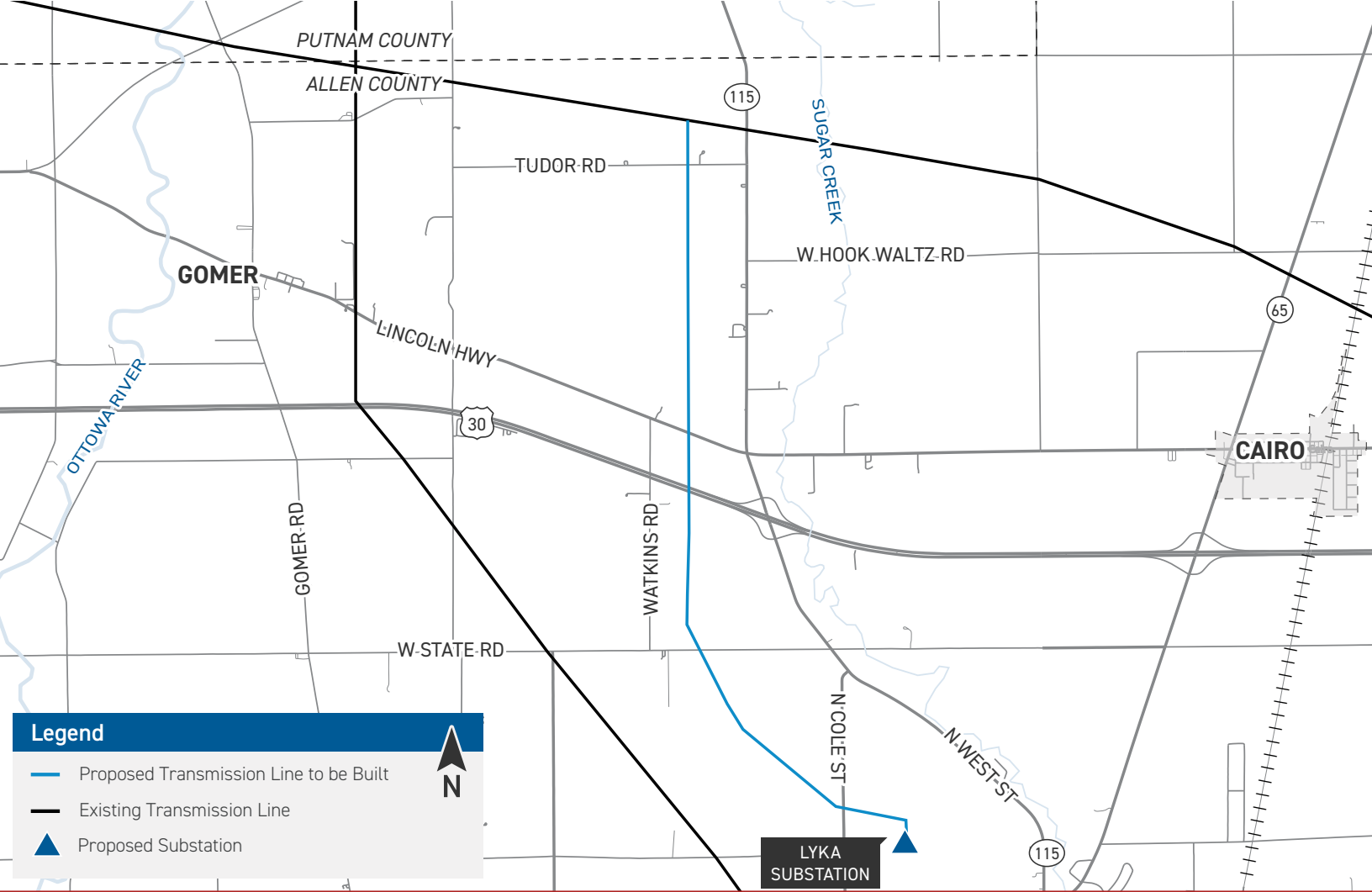
Where

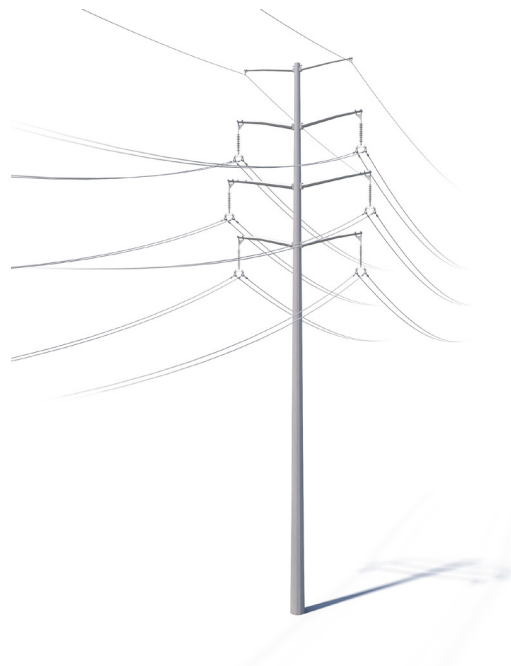


Typical Structures
