WESTERN MARION AREA IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

Indiana Michigan Power (I&M) plans to strengthen the electric transmission system in north eastern Indiana. The proposed improvements in Grant County involve rebuilding about 5 miles of power line and upgrading several local substations. The project involves rebuilding some sections of line in the company's current right-of-way. Other sections of the project include re-routes and require new easements. These improvements increase reliability, reduce power outages and speed recovery of service when outages occur.



WHAT

This project could include:

- Rebuilding about 5 miles of 34.5-kilovolt (kV) transmission line to 69-kV standards
- Upgrading several local substations

Improvements:


- Strengthen the local electric transmission system

WHERE


The upgrades take place in Center and Franklin townships in Grant County.

TYPICAL STRUCTURES

I&M plans on using steel monopole structures averaging **75-feet** in height. Structures will be placed within a **60-foot** right-of-way.

Portions of the line will be built in or adjacent to the existing right-of-way, other areas will require construction in new areas and with new easements.
