

Naismith Transmission Line Project

AEP Texas representatives plan to improve electric reliability in San Patricio County.

What

The project involves building two new 138-kilovolt transmission lines approximately 3 miles and upgrading equipment at the Naismith Substation.

AEP Texas officials plan to file a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC) following a review of public input on route link development and additional route analysis. Project representatives expect to file a CCN application by early 2027. The final line route is determined by the PUC.

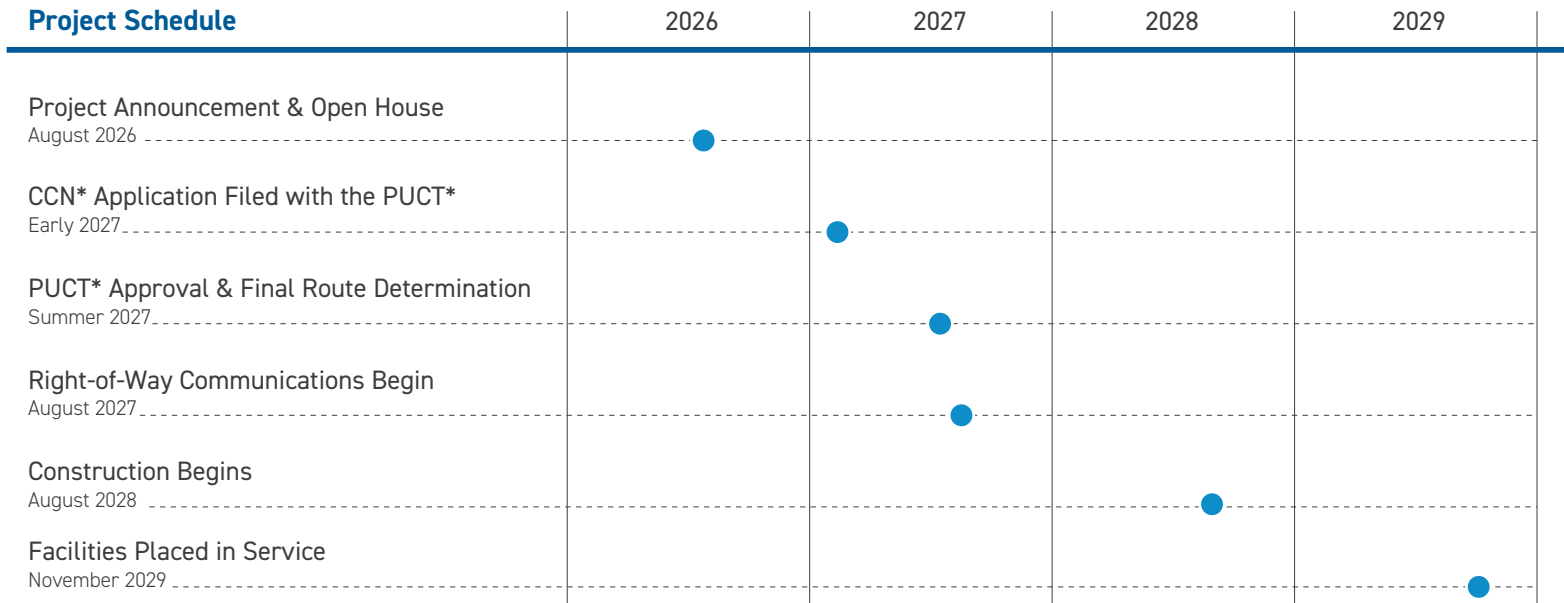
Why

Project Schedule

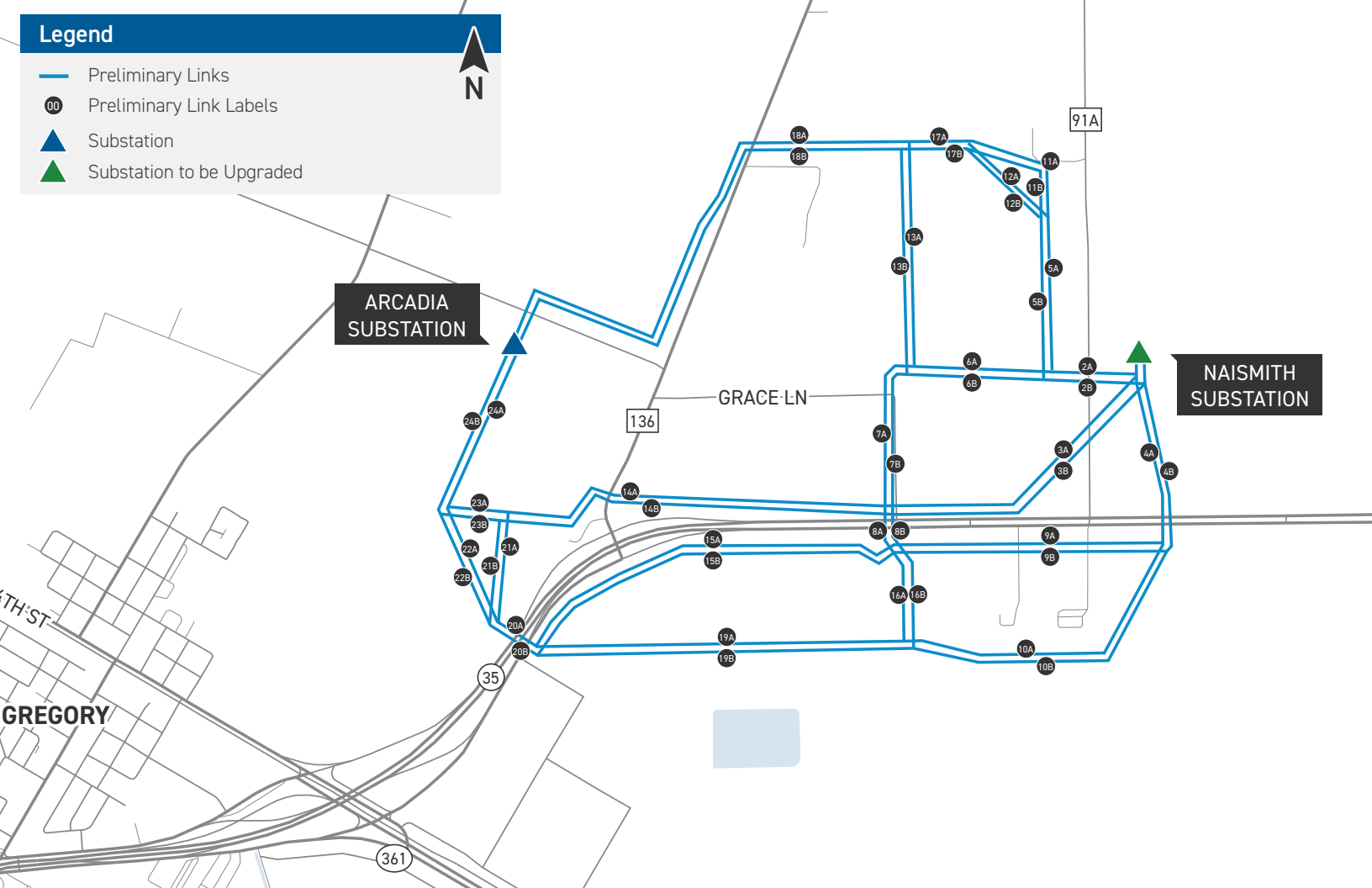
