Transmission Line Rebuild Project



Appalachian Power plans to strengthen the electric transmission system in northern Dickenson County, Virginia by making upgrades to the local power grid.

The Haysi Transmission Line Rebuild Project includes rebuilding about 7 miles of the Elkhorn City – Fremont – Grundy 69-kilovolt (kV) transmission line to ensure continued reliable service to customers.

The majority of work will take place within or adjacent to the company's existing utility easements. Construction is expected to start in the spring of 2018 and be complete by mid-2019.

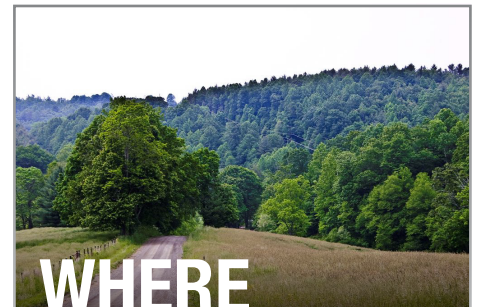
Estimated budget is \$15 million.



The Haysi Transmission Line Rebuild Project consists of upgrading about 7 miles of existing 69 kV transmission line with new steel structures. The upgrades will provide customers in the area with a reliable transmission system capable of handling increased power demand.

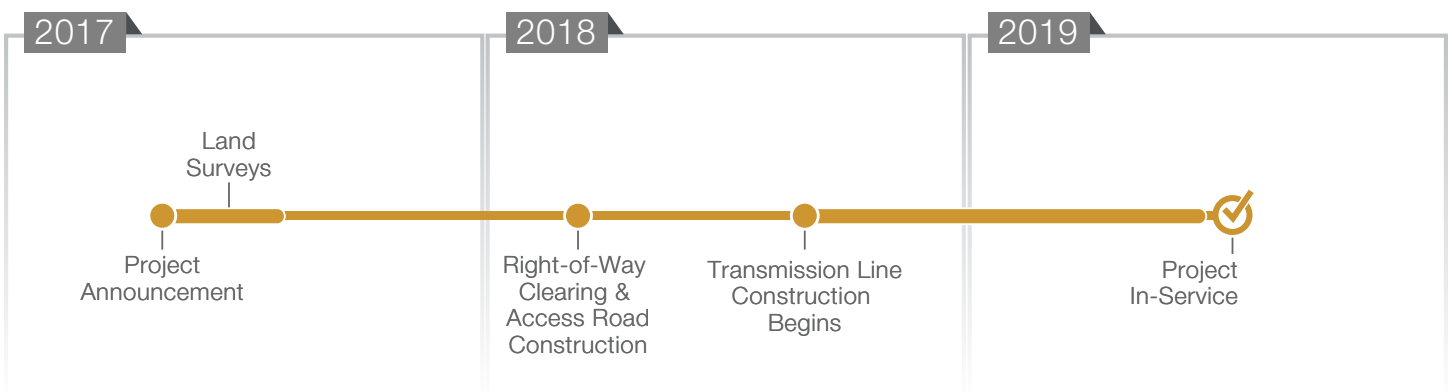


The existing line is a section of the Elkhorn City – Fremont – Grundy 69 kV transmission line and is more than 90 years old. The aging wood structures must be replaced with modern equipment to provide a robust transmission system and a reliable flow of electricity for our customers.



The project starts on the ridge of Pine Mountain, just south of the Kentucky – Virginia border. The line travels south through the Jefferson National Forest for about a mile to the Haysi Substation west of Main Street in Haysi. The line continues south from Haysi crossing Dickenson Highway and ending near Providence Drive just north of Clinchco.

*Timeline is approximate and is subject to change.

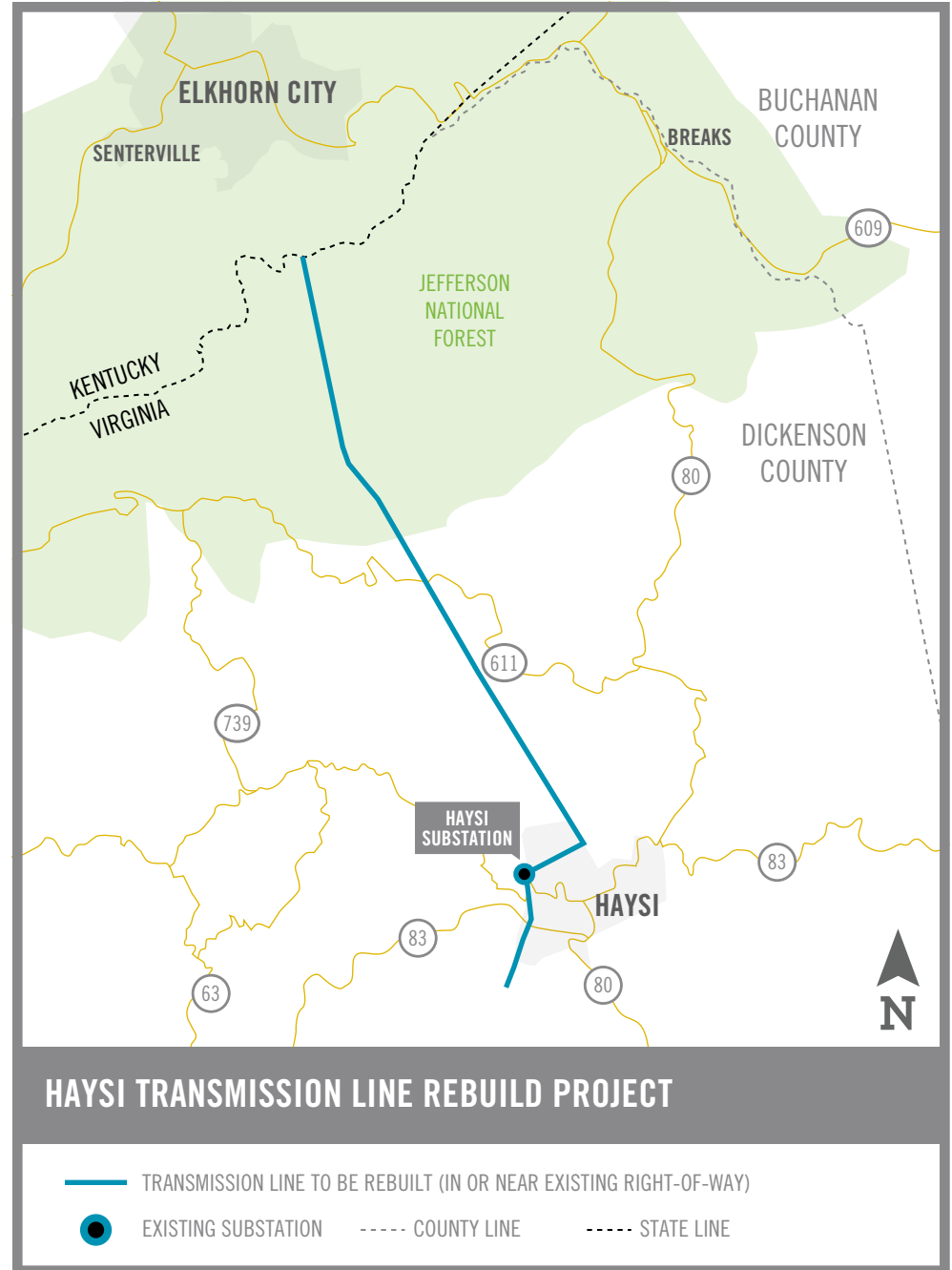
Typical Structures

The typical structure along the route will be a steel H-Frame that is about 100 feet tall. The typical right-of-way will be 100 feet wide. Appalachian Power is committed to carefully balancing the energy needs of homes and businesses while protecting the environment and natural beauty of the region.
